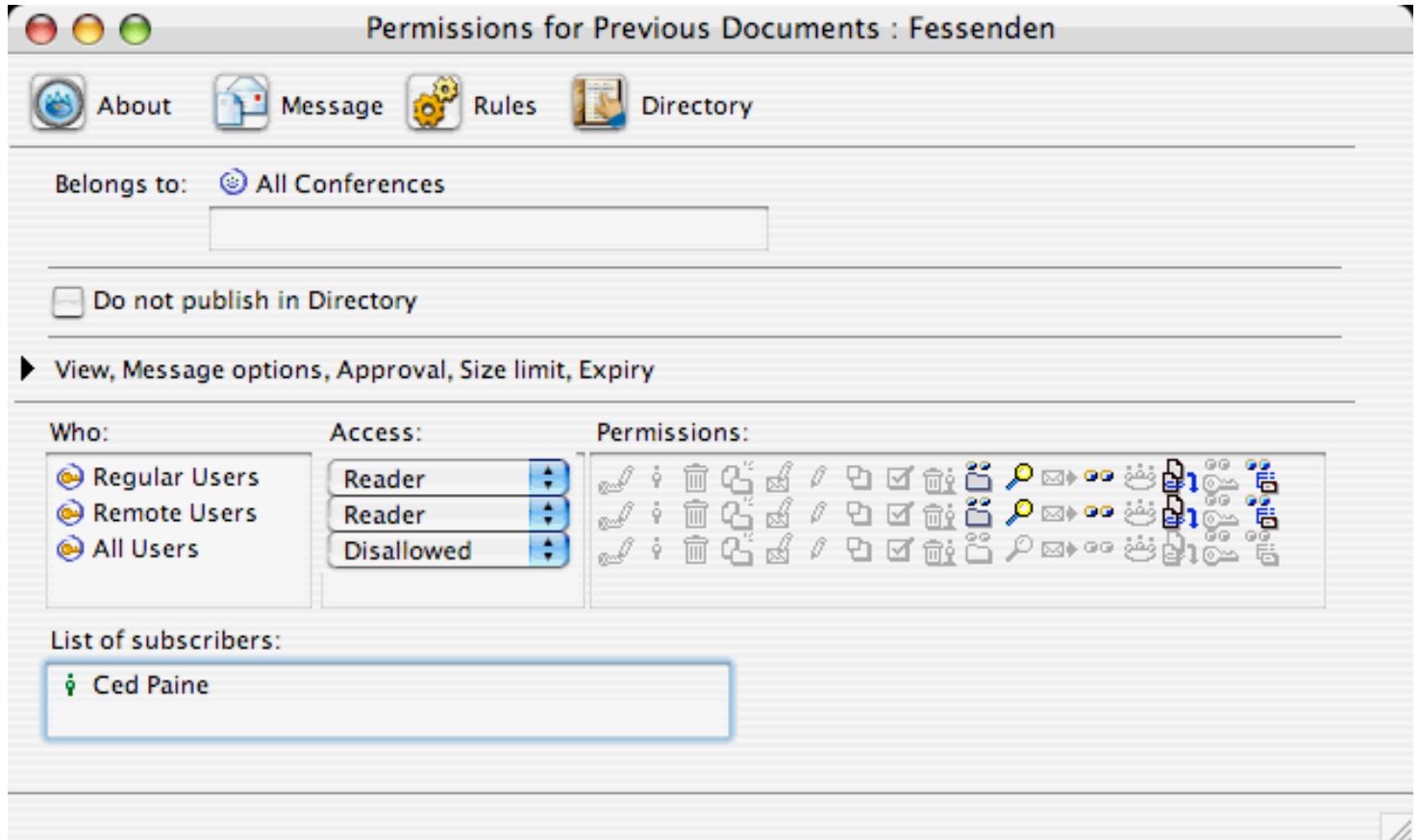


I experimented with this a few years ago. If you put your web pages in a conference inside your Home Page Folder, you can set the permissions on the conference so that only people with accounts on your system can open it and view its contents:



Users attempting to access a link to to a file inside the conference will be presented with a login screen. For example:
