

Making a Web Page/Learning HTML (Hyper Text Markup Language)

Commands in the language are in angle brackets:

```
<HTML>  
<HEAD>  
</HEAD>  
<BODY>  
</BODY>  
</HTML>  
<H1>  
<H6>
```

Either upper or lower case in the commands is fine

What some commands do:

```
<H1> makes text really big  
<H6> makes text really small  
<CENTER> center aligns text  
<UL> is for making an Unordered List  
    Inside the list, each List Item is done with <LI>
```

To make a webpage, you open up a word document and type in the following:

```
***Top of Page***  
<HTML>  
<HEAD>  
***Put your header here***  
</HEAD>  
<BODY>  
***Put your body here***  
<H1> This text is really big </H1>  
<H2> This text is not quite as big </H2>  
<CENTER><H2> This text is centered </H2></CENTER>  
<H6> This text is really small </H6>  
<UL>  
<LI> My first list item </LI>  
<LI> My second list item </LI>  
<LI> My last list item </LI>  
</UL>  
  
</BODY>  
</HTML>  
***End of Page***
```

When we want to save our word document, we want to do a “Save As” and save it as plaintext, but with .htm extension (Rule of 4).

Now, we have made the web page. Go to where you saved it, write click on it, and pick “open with” and open it with your favorite web browser (e.g. internet explorer).
